

ACCESSING THE INTERNET WITH A GAMING DEVICE

Pupils can access the internet on their Xbox or PlayStation and so access most forms of home learning. Here are some of the applications accessible through these devices –

On an Xbox the following worked well: Google Classroom, Seesaw, Spelling Shed, TT Rockstars, MyMaths and many more.

On the PlayStation the following all worked well: Google Classroom, Spelling Shed, TT Rockstars, MyMaths and many more. PlayStation's browser does not support pupil logins on Seesaw.

To access all the above, the child/parent will need to download the web browser onto their console (it should already be installed on most).

For the Xbox;

1. Plug a keyboard into the Xbox USB slot if you prefer this to a controller.
2. Go to 'my games and apps'.
3. Find Microsoft Edge and select (other browsers can be downloaded).
4. Type in the website you wish to access and continue like a standard laptop/tablet.



For the PlayStation;

1. Find the PlayStation internet browser icon (it is WWW with dots)
2. If you've not used this before, press the PlayStation logo on the controller.
3. Go to the library and find options for games and applications.
4. Go into the applications and you should find the internet browser →
5. Type in the website you wish to access and continue like a standard laptop/tablet.
