Key 'learning and doing' + useful links . . .

English: 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan – continued from Spring 1.

Writing to Provoke an Emotional Response: The children will write a diary based on our class text.

Writing to Persuade: The children will create a persuasive advert and write and perform a persuasive speech.

Maths:

- identify 3-D shapes, including cubes and other cuboids, from 2-D representations
- use the properties of rectangles to deduce related facts and find missing lengths and angles
- distinguish between regular and irregular polygons based on reasoning about equal sides and angles.
- identify, describe and represent the position of a shape following a reflection or translation, using the appropriate language, and know that the shape has not changed.
